

Dear Members,

In the Gully Number, Volume 1, Number 14, dated Jan. 27th 1980 the leading article was by Wendy Barber on behalf of the Development Committee of T.T.G. Athletias Centre. The article briefly summarised the history of our Centre and our efforts to obtain a permanent home and the reasons for wanting that home.

Since that article appeared many new members have joined our Centre, for these people I would like to repeat the main points of that article and for all members I will tell you of the latest developments for an athletic's track at St. Agnes.

Since T.F.G. Little Athletics started in 1972 it has been the aim of the Centre to obtain a permanent home. After the senior club was started in 1975, to give ex T.T.G. Little Athletics the opportunity to continue in athletics locally, this aim became more urgent. The main reasons for wishing to move from Pulkana Oval are:—

- 1. Each of clubroom and associated facilities.

 It has been the policy of T.T.G. Council to prohibit the erection of any more guildings on Bulkana Oval. It is felt by T.T.G. Athletics Centre Management Committee that change rooms and clubrooms together with the associated facilities are necessary for a united and successful club.
- 2. Lack of throwing facilities.
 Sonior athletes need to practice discus, javelin and hammer throwing. A separate area is needed because of the dangers involved. There is no separate area available at Bulkana Oval.
- 5. Size of track.
 Not a major problem, but it is impossible to fit a full size track on Bulkana.

There are other reasons such as the lack of shade and Bulkana not being located contrally in the T.T.G. area. Since May 1973 the Centre has been raising funds through Bingo. The initial aim was to raise funds to buy equipment and for the everyday expenses of the Centre. So successful was this fund raising effort that not only was the Centre able to purchase all the equipment it needed but it was able to accumulate funds for the eventual building of a clubroom.

After several unsuccessful efforts to obtain a permanent home, the committee became aware of the intended development of the Smart Road refuse tip as a recreation area, subsequently negotiations took place between ourselves and T.T.G. Council culminating in the decision of the T.T.G. Council on 22nd April 1980, to endeavour to complete the track and field facilities within 3 years, and for T.T.G. Athletics to arrange for the building of the amenities building within 3 years. The State Government's Dept. of Recreation & Sport were informed of the intended project and of our intention to apply to them for financial assistance towards the cost of the building.

At their suggestion we contacted other local organisations in the area to see whether it was feasible for these groups to share the funding and use of the building's facilities. The first meeting of these local groups was held on July 24th, 1980 and since that time the groups have met regularly and a committee has been formed and recognised by T.T.G. Council to assist T.T.G. Council in the development of the reclaimed area at St. Agnes. It was finally agreed that only 2 groups from the 5 groups originally involved has the compatibility and financial assets to be involved in the designing and building of the clubrooms, namely T.T.G. City Soccer Club and ourselves. Negotiations are currently taking place between our two clubs.

At the present time T.T.G. Council has not given us any indications that the completion date of mid 1983 will not be met.

RULES FOR SHOT PUT AND DISCUS EVENTS.

To be a valid throw and measured.

- 1. The throw must be commenced from a stationary position.
- 2. The athlete may enter the circle from any direction, but must leave from the rear half.
- 3. The athlete must not leave the circle until the implement has landed.
- 4. The athlete must leave the circle from a standing position.
- 5. The athlete must not touch the circle or the ground outside the circle (nor the top of the Stop board in the shot) during the throw.
- 6. The shot or discus must fall so that the point of impact is within the inner edges of the lines marking the sector. (It does not matter where the implements go after the first impact).
- 7. The implement must not be improperly released, (e.g. dropped) during a trial.
- 8. If no rules are infringed a trial may be interrupted. The implement must be laid down and the competitor return to a stationary position. Only one interruption is allowed per trial.

For the SHOT PUT

- a) The shot must be held in one hand close to the chin when the athlete takes his stance to commence the trial. (NOTE: A recent S.A.L.A.A. ruling "close to the chin" is within one inch)
- b) The shot must not be brought from behind the line of the shoulders.
- MEASURING 1. The DISCUS to the nearest even centimetre below.
 - 2. The SHOT to the nearest centimetre below.
 - 3. Measured from the nearest mark of the implement to the inner edge of the circle.
